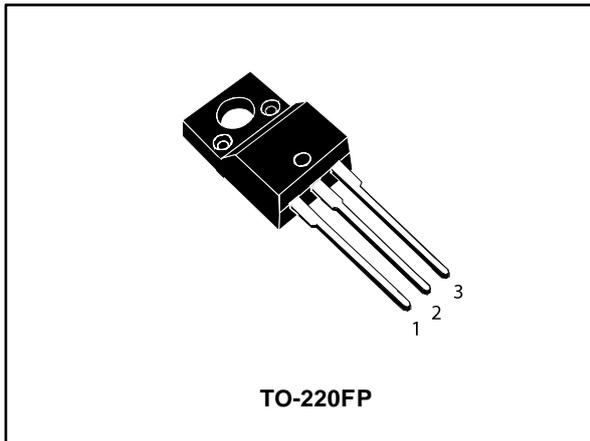



Figure 1: Internal schematic diagram





Figure 13: Test circuit for resistive load switching times




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Figure 14: Test circuit for gate charge behavior




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Figure 15: Test circuit for inductive load switching and diode recovery times




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Figure 16: Unclamped inductive load test circuit




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Figure 17: Unclamped inductive waveform

Figure 19: TO-220FP package outline


