General Description

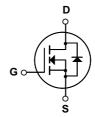
These N-Channel enhancement mode power field effect transistors are produced using Fairchild's proprietary, planar stripe, DMOS technology.

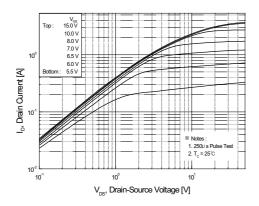


Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics

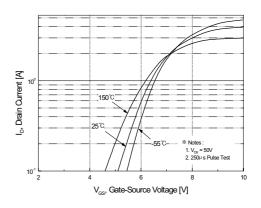


Figure 2. Transfer Characteristics

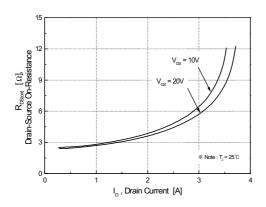


Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation vs. Drain Current and Gate Voltage

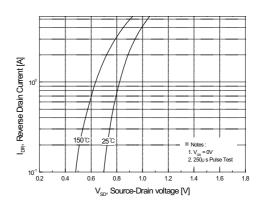


Figure 4. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation vs. Source Current and Temperature

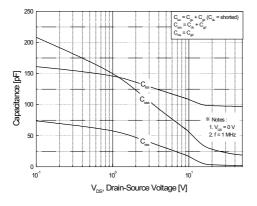


Figure 5. Capacitance Characteristics

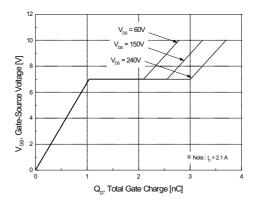


Figure 6. Gate Charge Characteristics

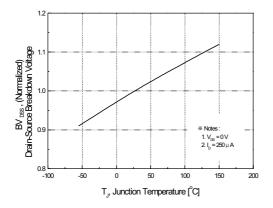
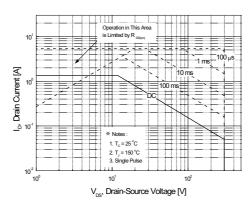


Figure 7. Breakdown Voltage Variation vs. Temperature

Figure 8. On-Resistance Variation vs. Temperature



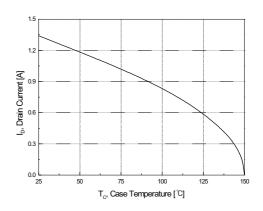


Figure 9. Maximum Safe Operating Area

Figure 10. Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature

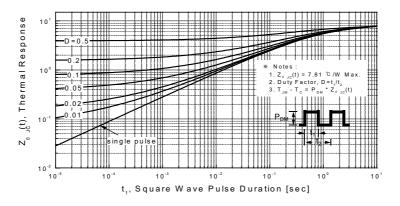
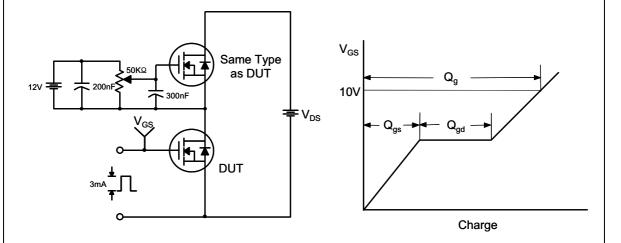


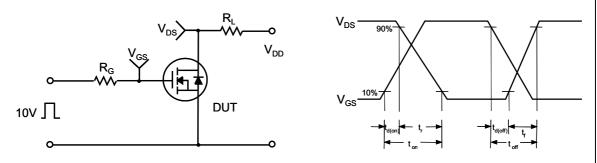
Figure 11. Transient Thermal Response Curve

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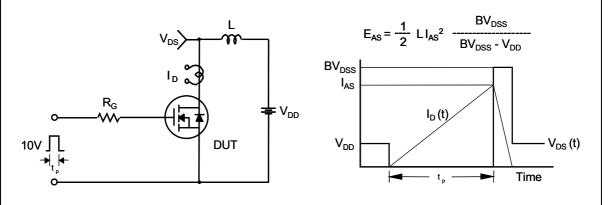
Gate Charge Test Circuit & Waveform



Resistive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms

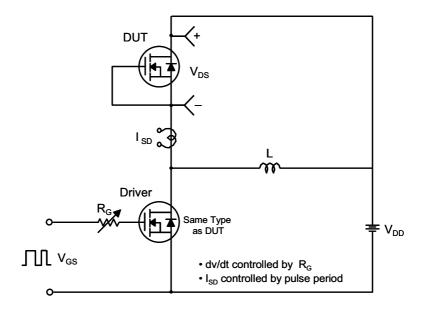


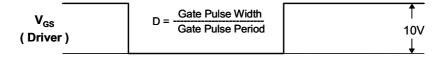
Unclamped Inductive Switching Test Circuit & Waveforms

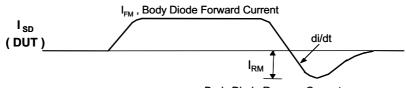


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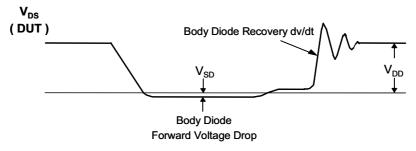
Peak Diode Recovery dv/dt Test Circuit & Waveforms
